DECLARATION OF LOCAL STATE OF EMERGENCY

Pursuant to the authority vested in the office of Mayor by the Illinois Municipal Code Section 5/11-1-6, the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act Section 3305/11 and Ordinance No. 2020-5430 of the City of Mattoon, I, Rick Hall, Mayor of the City of Mattoon do hereby declare that a Local State of Emergency exists as of this date, July 06, 2021, and shall continue until such time as provided in Ordinance No. 2020-5430.

WHEREAS, on January 30, 2020, the World Health Organization declared the outbreak of COVID-19 to be a public health emergency of international concern and on March 11, 2020 declared a worldwide pandemic; and

WHEREAS, on January 31, 2020, the U.S. Health and Human Services Secretary declared a public health emergency for the United States; and

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of Illinois has issued a disaster proclamation on March 9, 2020 due to the impact of the COVID-19 virus and has activated the State Emergency Operations Center; and

WHEREAS, the State Emergency Management Agency has declared a public health emergency due to the impact of the COVID-19 virus; and

WHEREAS, the City Administration has coordinated its response with other Coles County governmental entities.

The nature of the emergency is related to the COVID-19 virus which is causing or anticipated to cause widespread impacts on the health of members of the community.

During the existence of the Local State of Emergency, the Mayor shall execute such authority as provided under the Illinois Municipal Code, the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act and Ordinance No. 2020-5430.

This Declaration of Local State of Emergency shall be filed with the City Clerk as soon as practicable.

I, Rick Hall, whose name is signed to this instrument, being first duly sworn, signed and executed the instrument as the Declaration of Local State of Emergency, and that I signed willingly, and that I executed it as my free and voluntary act for the purposes therein expressed.

Discussion of Topics from the June 22, 2021 Council Planning Meeting.

Mayor Hall recapped the Council Planning Meeting from June 22, 2021 by noting the objectives for the next four years. The Council had determined the seven highest priorities as follows: 1. Economic Development/Marketing, 2. Residential Subdivisions, 3. More Cops , 4. Reform Tourism/New Events, 5. Liquor License Update, 6. City Manager Form of Government, and 7. Grant Writer. Mayor Hall acknowledged several of the items were set in motion with #6 being something the Council cannot do – must go to referendum. Council discussed the seven priorities (Commissioner Closson attended by audio means at 7:10 p.m.), involvement of community, City finances and Mattoon in Motion's involvement.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS:

CITY ADMINISTRATOR/COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT noted flooding was the big topic since the occurrence and Red Cross not having enough reports of citizens displaced; prepared for mediation with the PBPA union; and communicated with developers. Mayor Hall opened the floor for questions with no response.

CITY ATTORNEY noted the Quakenbush case was to have a Judge tour of the facilities and upcoming nuisance property trials. Mayor Hall opened the floor for questions with no response.

CITY CLERK noted assisting auditors, preparing a variety of reports, and processing insurance.

FINANCE announced the first installment of property taxes; distributed and reviewed the Revenue Tracking Sheet including tax receipts and unrestricted cash. Mayor Hall opened the floor for questions. Treasurer & Director Wright noted 100% of the property taxes went to Fire and Police pensions and Library.

PUBLIC WORKS updated Council on the Mattoon High School watermain project, north side of Broadway's sidewalk project and Wolf Park radio tower removal delay until September. Mayor Hall opened the floor for questions with no response.

FIRE reported on calls for service, inspections and follow-ups, training, 4th of July dumpster fire calls due to fireworks, need to revamp the fireworks ordinance for next year; attended Naperville Kiwanis' Safety Town for young children to learn about various ways for safety with discussion of a County summer camp in the future; and attended a funeral for a Wabash Fire Protection District firefighter, Mehdi Mourad.

POLICE reported on calls for service with 52 arrests, many upcoming events for manning and new hires starting PTI today. Mayor Hall noted the new hires were replacements for earlier retirements. Mayor Hall opened the floor for questions with no response.

ARTS AND TOURISM reported 4th of July event was well received and thanked Public Works, Fire Department's flag, and Police Department's presence; announced Bagelfest next week, and Mural's bright spot in town with a dedication on the 14th at 9:00 a.m. Mayor Hall opened the floor for questions with no response.

COMMENTS BY THE COUNCIL

Council commented on the flooding and challenges of processing five inches of rain with improvements over the years within the City, and complimented Departments for all they do. Commissioner Closson reported on activities within his Departments. Mayor Hall added issues with Friday night burnouts, less IDOT mowing, and motorized bicycles to be addressed.

Mayor Hall seconded by Commissioner Cox moved to recess to closed session at 7:35 p.m. pursuant to the Illinois Open Meetings Act for the purpose of the discussion of the appointment, compensation, discipline, performance, or dismissal of specific employees of the City or legal counsel for the City. (5ILCS 120 (2)(C)(1)); collective negotiating matters between the City of Mattoon and its employees or their representatives, or deliberations concerning salary schedules for one or more classes of employees (5ILCS 120 (2)(C)(2)); litigation which is affecting the City and an action is probable or imminent (5ILCS 120 (2)(C)(11)).
