### DECLARATION OF LOCAL STATE OF EMERGENCY

Pursuant to the authority vested in the office of Mayor by the Illinois Municipal Code Section 5/11-1-6, the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act Section 3305/11 and Ordinance No. 2020-5430 of the City of Mattoon, I, Rick Hall, Mayor of the City of Mattoon do hereby declare that a Local State of Emergency exists as of this date, October 19, 2021, and shall continue until such time as provided in Ordinance No. 2020-5430.

**WHEREAS**, on January 30, 2020, the World Health Organization declared the outbreak of COVID-19 to be a public health emergency of international concern and on March 11, 2020 declared a worldwide pandemic; and

**WHEREAS**, on January 31, 2020, the U.S. Health and Human Services Secretary declared a public health emergency for the United States; and

**WHEREAS**, the Governor of the State of Illinois has issued a disaster proclamation on March 9, 2020 due to the impact of the COVID-19 virus and has activated the State Emergency Operations Center; and

**WHEREAS**, the State Emergency Management Agency has declared a public health emergency due to the impact of the COVID-19 virus; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Administration has coordinated its response with other Coles County governmental entities.

The nature of the emergency is related to the COVID-19 virus which is causing or anticipated to cause widespread impacts on the health of members of the community.

During the existence of the Local State of Emergency, the Mayor shall execute such authority as provided under the Illinois Municipal Code, the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act and Ordinance No. 2020-5430.

This Declaration of Local State of Emergency shall be filed with the City Clerk as soon as practicable.

I, Rick Hall, whose name is signed to this instrument, being first duly sworn, signed and executed the instrument as the Declaration of Local State of Emergency, and that I signed willingly, and that I executed it as my free and voluntary act for the purposes therein expressed.

FIRE thanked the Council for the new hires; and reported on the calls for service, inspections and follow-ups, training, and November 3<sup>rd</sup> FAA inspection at the airport. Mayor Hall opened the floor for questions. Commissioner Cox inquired as to the inspection replacement since Engineer Spurgeon retired with Chief Hilligoss announcing Andy Cole would attend inspection classes to be certified.

POLICE noted calls for service with 46 arrests. Mayor Hall inquired as to the implementation of a Fire & Police Explorer Group. Chief Gaines noted the process had started to find volunteers for the program. Chief Hilligoss added local children to be involved and possible future employees. Commissioner Graven noted success of past Explorer programs. Mayor Hall opened the floor for questions with no response.

Commissioner Cox seconded by Commissioner Graven moved to recess to closed session at 7:08 p.m. pursuant to the Illinois Open Meetings Act for the purpose of the discussion of the appointment, compensation, discipline, performance, or dismissal of specific employees of the City or legal counsel for the City. (5ILCS 120 (2)(C)(1)).

Council reconvened at 8:11 p.m.

Mayor Hall seconded by Commissioner Cox moved to approve Council Decision Request 2021-2191, approving the promotion of Police Officer Devin Patterson to the rank of Sergeant, effective October 23, 2021, due to the retirement of Lt. Sweeney and the unprecedented circumstances of needing to maintain 15 Command Officers to most effectively protect the citizens of Mattoon and there is no current Lieutenants' List in effect.
