PUBLIC HEARING

Mayor Rick Hall opened the Public Hearing on the project performance of the Blue Cross/Blue Shield Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) at 6:21 p.m. in the City Hall Council Chambers. Mr. Kelly Lockhart, Executive Director of Coles County Regional Planning and Development Commission (CCRP-DC) and Project Representative noted the due notice of the public hearing in the Journal Gazette-Times Courier on December 11, 2021. Mr. Lockhart noted the purpose of the public hearing was to provide interested parties with the amount of CDBG funds originally applied by the City of Mattoon, the awarded CDBG grant, a description of the CDBG project's use of the grant funds, the milestones and accomplishments of the project, and a description of any variances to the initial concept described in the CDBG grant application. Mr. Lockhart continued with the approval of submission of the \$480,000 application under the provisions of the Economic Development Community Development Block Grant Program (CDBG) administered by the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity (DCEO) on June 6, 2019. The City of Mattoon also agreed to invest \$30,000 for program administration. Mr. Lockhart stated the grant was applied for the purpose of constructing a road for a private sector investment in the amount of \$15,216,945 to allow the Blue Cross/Blue Shield development which would create at least 48 FTE jobs. The Illinois Department of Transportation also awarded a grant of \$855,250.02 for this project. Mr. Lockhart stated the project was now complete including the employment of 52 FTE jobs, which was 73.1% of those were low- to moderate-income and injected \$16,137,551.02 in the private sector investment, exceeding the \$15,216,945 agreement with the State of Illinois. Mr. Lockhart noted the few variances to the initial project's implementation, but the construction process went as planned. Mayor Hall opened the floor for Public comment on the grant. Director Barber reiterated the significance of 50 jobs added. Mayor Hall added a beautiful building with a win-win for everyone. With no further comments Mayor Hall closed the Public Hearing at 6:25 p.m.

DECLARATION OF LOCAL STATE OF EMERGENCY

Pursuant to the authority vested in the office of Mayor by the Illinois Municipal Code Section 5/11-1-6, the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act Section 3305/11 and Ordinance No. 2020-5430 of the City of Mattoon, I, Rick Hall, Mayor of the City of Mattoon do hereby declare that a Local State of Emergency exists as of this date, December 21, 2021, and shall continue until such time as provided in Ordinance No. 2020-5430.

WHEREAS, on January 30, 2020, the World Health Organization declared the outbreak of COVID-19 to be a public health emergency of international concern and on March 11, 2020 declared a worldwide pandemic; and

WHEREAS, on January 31, 2020, the U.S. Health and Human Services Secretary declared a public health emergency for the United States; and

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of Illinois has issued a disaster proclamation on March 9, 2020 due to the impact of the COVID-19 virus and has activated the State Emergency Operations Center; and

WHEREAS, the State Emergency Management Agency has declared a public health emergency due to the impact of the COVID-19 virus; and

WHEREAS, the City Administration has coordinated its response with other Coles County governmental entities.

The nature of the emergency is related to the COVID-19 virus which is causing or anticipated to cause widespread impacts on the health of members of the community.

During the existence of the Local State of Emergency, the Mayor shall execute such authority as provided under the Illinois Municipal Code, the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act and Ordinance No. 2020-5430.

This Declaration of Local State of Emergency shall be filed with the City Clerk as soon as practicable.

I, Rick Hall, whose name is signed to this instrument, being first duly sworn, signed and executed the instrument as the Declaration of Local State of Emergency, and that I signed willingly, and that I executed it as my free and voluntary act for the purposes therein expressed.

FINANCE – Commissioner Graven distributed the Financial Report for November from Director and Treasurer Wright, noting the income and use taxes were based on the new census per capital which caused a decrease of \$18,437.27 for December.
