#### DECLARATION OF LOCAL STATE OF EMERGENCY

State of Illinois County of Coles City of Mattoon

Pursuant to the authority vested in the office of Mayor by the Illinois Municipal Code Section 5/11-1-6, the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act Section 3305/11 and Ordinance No. 2020-5430 of the City of Mattoon, I, Rick Hall, Mayor of the City of Mattoon do hereby declare that a Local State of Emergency exists as of this date, December 20, 2022, and shall continue until such time as provided in Ordinance No. 2020-5430.

WHEREAS, on January 30, 2020, the World Health Organization declared the outbreak of COVID-19 to be a public health emergency of international concern and on March 11, 2020 declared a worldwide pandemic; and

**WHEREAS**, on January 31, 2020, the U.S. Health and Human Services Secretary declared a public health emergency for the United States; and

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of Illinois has issued a disaster proclamation on March 9, 2020 due to the impact of the COVID-19 virus and has activated the State Emergency Operations Center; and

WHEREAS, the State Emergency Management Agency has declared a public health emergency due to the impact of the COVID-19 virus; and

WHEREAS, the City Administration has coordinated its response with other Coles County governmental entities.

The nature of the emergency is related to the COVID-19 virus which is causing or anticipated to cause widespread impacts on the health of members of the community.

During the existence of the Local State of Emergency, the Mayor shall execute such authority as provided under the Illinois Municipal Code, the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act and Ordinance No. 2020-5430.

This Declaration of Local State of Emergency shall be filed with the City Clerk as soon as practicable.

# A RESOLUTION OF SUPPORT FOR A STATE OF ILLINOIS "COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT" (CDBG) APPLICATION AND COMMITMENT OF CITY FUNDS

**WHEREAS**, the City of Mattoon intends to construct a series of drainage improvements on the west side of the community known as the Little Wabash Drainage Project; and

**WHEREAS**, the first phase of said series of projects is the construction of approximately 3,130' of 60" storm sewer from the Little Wabash River to IL-16 (Marshall Avenue), a.k.a. the Little Wabash Drainage Project – Phase 1 Piping; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the City Council for the City of Mattoon, Coles County, Illinois as follows:

- 1) that the City of Mattoon apply for a grant under the terms and conditions of the State of Illinois and shall enter into and agree to the understandings and assurances contained in said application.
- 2) that the Mayor and City Clerk on behalf of the City of Mattoon execute such documents and all other documents necessary for the carrying out of said application.
- 3) that the Mayor and City Clerk are authorized to provide such additional information as may be required to accomplish the obtaining of such grant.
- 4) that the City of Mattoon does hereby commit funds from the Capital Projects Fund in the amount of \$375,000.00 for use in conjunction with an Illinois Community Development Block Grant, for an estimated total project cost of \$1,300,000.00.

Mayor Hall reminded all to replace their smoke/carbon monoxide detectors, urged all to park in their driveways for an easier snow removal, and enforcement of new laws effective January 1st for the Police Department.
