A SPECIAL ORDINANCE DECLARING PERSONAL PROPERTY OWNED BY THE MUNICIPALITY SURPLUS AND AUTHORIZING THE SALE OR DISPOSAL OF THE PROPERTY

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL FOR THE CITY OF MATTOON, COLES COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

Section 1. Supplies and equipment identified on Exhibit A to this ordinance are no longer necessary or useful to, or for the best interest of, the City of Mattoon, and are hereby declared surplus to the needs of the City of Mattoon.

Section 2. The City of Mattoon, Illinois does not express any warranty or imply any statement of condition of this surplus property. The Department Heads are hereby authorized to administratively sell by the most advantageous means and to negotiate the conditions for the sale, recycle, or other disposition of the property without further formal consideration or approval by the City Council. The City of Mattoon shall reserve the right to accept or reject any and/or all offers for this property.

Section 3. The Mayor and City Clerk are authorized and directed to execute any documents necessary to complete the sale or disposal of the property.

Section 4. This ordinance shall be deemed published as of the day of its adoption and approval by the City Council.

Section 5. This ordinance shall be effective upon its approval as provided by law.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS

CITY ADMINISTRATOR updated Council on replacements for vacating personnel, keeping up with legislation updates and ordinances, and working on the EEOP Plan. Mayor Hall opened the floor for questions with no response.

CITY ATTORNEY noted business as usual. Mayor Hall opened the floor for questions with no response.

CITY CLERK noted processing insurance enrollments/changes and new hires; otherwise, business as usual.

FINANCE announced receipt of the final installation of property taxes after receiving \$5.19 million and levied \$5.26 million; and distributed and reviewed the October Financial Report including the revenues/expenditures, cumulative cash position, Revenue Tracking Report and unrestricted cash. Mayor Hall opened the floor for questions with no response.

PUBLIC WORKS announced receipt of a grant agreement with IDOT for the roadways at the sports complex and would have Council action at the next meeting. Mayor Hall opened the floor for questions with no response.

FIRE reported on calls for service including three structure fires with no injuries, five firefighters graduated from Peoria Fire Academy, KC Summers lent an electric vehicle for transportation to the Academy, training; and distributed a summary of fixes on the fleet of apparatus with a request for a new fire truck at the next council meeting as well as a grant for a ladder truck. Mayor Hall opened the floor for questions with no response.

POLICE reported on calls for service, 42 arrests, and an anonymous tip leading to an arrest of an individual with a gun. Mayor Hall opened the floor for questions with no response.

ARTS AND TOURISM reported on participation at the Business Navigators Alliance in Effingham, new anthem, Lightworks walkthrough with 10,000 participants and 180 cars on Friday, lights Downtown with trees and displays at Heritage Park. Mayor Hall opened the floor for questions. Mayor Hall noted there were a lot of people and had positive comments. Director Burgett noted Hunan's Mae Chen was always supportive and always stepped up.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT reported on upcoming ordinances including waiver of permit fees for two years for new residential construction, revised alcohol ordinance for flexibility for new businesses, limiting gaming, Housing stock survey 70% complete while having Lake Land College students conduct the survey. Mayor Hall opened the floor for questions with no response.

COMMENTS BY THE COUNCIL

The Council wished everyone a Happy Thanksgiving. Commissioner Closson announced Parks Superintendent Kurt Stretch completed the installation of Lightworks and final mowing of the parks; and noted completion of the concrete sidewalk repair at the City Hall elevator entrance completed by City crews. Commissioner Cox complimented and thanked Roth & Company for the audit, the Police Department with their apprehension, and complimented Lightworks and the participating restaurants. Commissioner Graven thanked the auditors for their presentation and everyone in attendance. Commissioner Phipps announced Public Works Advisory Board re-appointments, interviews for public works director, and great Lightworks displays. Mayor Hall stated he had a lot to be thankful for.
